

Rights Strategy for Publishing Scientific Articles at NTNU Samfunnsforskning AS

NTNU Samfunnsforskning AS aims to make its research easily accessible and to contribute to new knowledge for the benefit of society. The institutes's research results shall be handled within the boundaries set by confidentiality and non-disclosure obligations.

- All scientific publications must be deposited in the company's institutional knowledge archive.
- NTNU Samfunnsforskning AS recommends the use of Creative Commons licenses for open access publishing, preferably [CC BY 4.0](#).

Rights to Scientific Articles

This rights strategy helps ensure that the company complies with the requirements of research funders by making scientific publications publicly available without delay (embargo). Researchers at NTNU Samfunnsforskning AS retain their rights without needing to provide additional notice to the publisher. They may make the final version of their peer-reviewed, accepted manuscript (AAM – Author Accepted Manuscript) openly available through self-archiving (Green OA).

With this policy, NTNU Samfunnsforskning AS informs publishers of scientific publications that accepted, peer-reviewed manuscripts by the institution's employees will be made openly available online under a Creative Commons sharing license. This applies regardless of any subsequent agreements made with publishers. The rights strategy applies to scientific articles published after April 20th, 2023.
